They hardly ever hit the headlines but like Mondragon in the Basque country, with its uninterupted growth over half a century to its present 85,000 membership, they demonstrate resiliance in difficult circumstances. We shall discuss running the regional HUB as a co-operative, cutting costs and sharing outputs in a variety of business ventures.

For example we are already producing BIODIESEL from waste cooking oil (WVO). Using the co-operative format means we can cut costs of production *by around 50*%, thereby significantly increasing commercial viability, as well as providing

a *direct financial benefit* to members.
